What:

High School Science Academy - The aim of this program is to give Omaha high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to participate in college-level lectures and field/lab work. Each month, students will explore a different topic in the biological sciences. They will participate in one full evening of lecture on a weeknight, followed by a half or full-day field or lab session on a weekend later in the month. All sessions will be taught by university professors and biologists, and will be supervised by NWRI's education staff.

Who:

Open to Omaha High School Juniors and Seniors who have a strong interest in biological sciences and would like the opportunity to learn from college professors and biologists on topics in biology.

How to apply: Complete the Student Interest Form and have your science teacher or counselor complete the Recommendation Form and ensure both are submitted to NWRI no later than September 4, 2015.
